## Clinical Tips: Finding Local Young Person Specific AOD Services and Information

Alcohol and Drug Foundation. A list of Australian alcohol and other drug support services can be searched by location and service type at the ADF website (<u>https://adf.org.au/help-support</u>).

Local non-government services. May include outpatient or inpatient options including detox or rehab and counselling services. The Australian Drug Information Network (<u>www.adin.com.au</u>) can help identify these services locally.

Local government services. Some local health districts may have outpatient or inpatient options.

The local hospital can advise on these.

Primary Health Networks (PHNs). Many PHNs are developing 'health pathways' that can assist locating services: <u>http://www.health.gov.au/internet/main/publishing.nsf/Content/PHN-Home</u>

PHNs may also be able to assist with identifying local clinicians with interest/skills.

### **Private hospitals**
